Mrs. Mandamin is an Ojibwe Quay from the Wikwemikong unceded Indian Reserve on Manitoulin Island in Lake Huron. As the lead Water Walk Grandmother, Mrs. Mandamin and her fellow Mother Earth Water Walkers are raising awareness about the importance of protecting our sacred water for future generations.

To demonstrate dedication to protecting our waters, Mrs. Mandamin organized walks around the perimeters of the Great Lakes each year from 2003-2007. In 2008, she and her companion Water Walkers will complete the circumnavigation of the entire Great Lakes. Josephine Mandamin and the other Water Walkers will arrive in Milwaukee Tuesday, May 6<sup>th</sup> and will spend the afternoon with us at Discovery World. She will speak about protecting our water from an indigenous perspective and perform a traditional water ceremony before continuing on the journey north.
